






Mental Health

Mental Health is responsible for 10% of the health gap between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and non-indigenous Australians. A long history of trauma, grief, loss and cultural disconnection means mental health issues can be complex. This requires culturally appropriate support that recognises the connection between physical health, mental health, spiritual needs and social and emotional wellbeing.



Under the invitation of KAMS, Link Up Team Leader: Pauline, Special Projects Officer: Cylia and Admin Assistant: Stana were lucky enough to participate in the Aboriginal Mental Health First Aid Course! Thoroughly enjoyed and learnt so much with Jarred from National Well-being and of course with the expertise of Jasmine Phillips.

This course teaches us how to identify the signs and symptoms of mental health problems, where and how to get help and what sort of help has been shown by research to be effective.



Shark Cage

As we look back, this program was created for us to find the sharks out there in the world, and how sometimes it is impossible to avoid them. Shark cage was designed to strengthen our cage of Human Rights so we can recognise the sharks before they become a part of our lives. We aimed to strengthen our Shark Cage and make sure it has a good alarm system!

We envisioned the outcome of this program helped to recognise a "respectful dolphin" and identify the characteristics of healthy relationships.

The Shark Cage® Framework

The 5-step framework is a way of preventing and understanding violence against girls and women. It draws on a powerful metaphor and multiple psychological modalities for working in trauma informed ways to empower girls and women.

Step 1: Introducing the Shark Cage Metaphor

Step 2: Renovating the Shark Cage

Step 3: Fixing the Shark Cage Alarm

Step 4: Defending the Shark Cage

Step 5: Recognizing Sharks and Dolphins





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




















Services

Link Up

The KSGAC Link Up Service is about reuniting the Stolen generation with lost family and/or country. KSGAC Caseworkers work with clients on a one-to-one basis to assist in looking for lost family and, if successful arrange a funded reunion.

Link-Up services gives priority to first generation clients, especially elderly clients and those requiring urgent assistance due to health concerns.

National Redress Scheme

The National Redress Scheme is in response to the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse. Applications can be made any time before 30 June 2027

KSGAC helps people with confidential applications for redress and can also provide counselling support.

Counselling Support for the Disability Royal Commission

The disability royal commission looks at ways to prevent people with disability from experiencing violence, abuse, neglect and exploitation.

KSGAC counsellors can help people with disability, their families and support people in their lives to talk about the issues they have faced in the past or now in the present.

Territories Redress Scheme

The territories Stolen Generations Redress Scheme provides support to Stolen Generations survivors who were removed from their families or communities in the:

- -Northern Territory, before 1 July 1978 or
- -Australian Capital Territory, before 11 May 1989 or
- -Jervis Bay Territory

Position Vacancies

The purpose of the Link Up Service is to assist Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, who have been affected by the past policies and practices of forced removal, to locate and reunite with their families.

We are looking for energetic individuals to join our Link Up Team. These rewarding roles include researching family history, arranging for family-gravesite and/or back to country reunions, as well as providing support to Stolen Generation members and KSGAC clients. You will enjoy travelling throughout the Kimberley region and, at time, to other States/Territories. These positions can be Broome or Kununurra based.

Link Up Caseworker

Caseworkers provide community information, education and awareness to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and Non-Indigenous people about the effects of past governments' practices of forced removal of children from their families. Part of this role is to provide information about the services available from the Bringing Them Home Report and Link Up counsellors, and related services such as family training organisations.

Link Up Counsellor

Link Up counsellors provide a range of counselling services to clients at all stages of the tracing and reunion process, as required. Counsellors will work as part of a team in the Link Up Service to provide counselling and education for clients who are engaged in tracing their families and/or planning a reunion.
